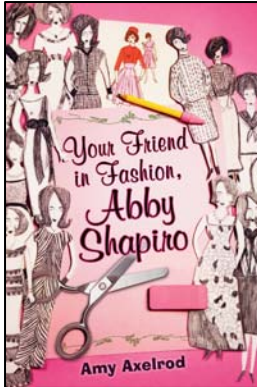

## POSSUM SUMMER

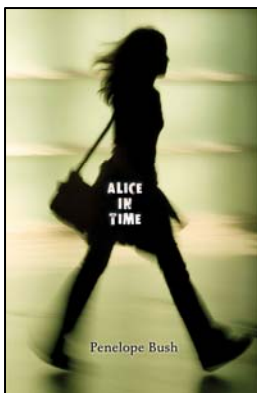

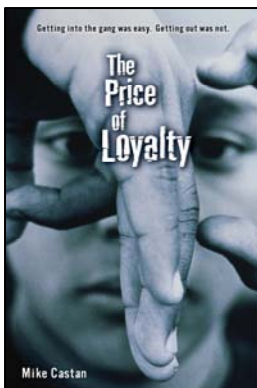


## ALICE IN TIME

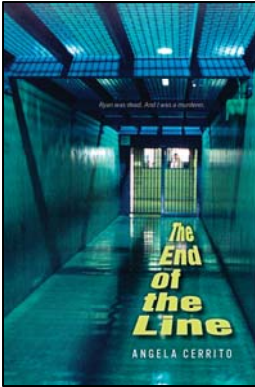


## THE PRICE OF LOYALTY

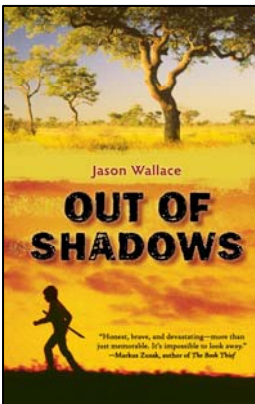
## WHERE I BELONG

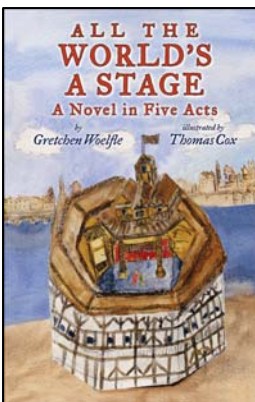
## OUT OF SHADOWS
