PAUL MEISEL, who holds a master of fine arts degree from Yale University, has illustrated more than sixty-five books for children, including *Go to Sleep*, *Groundhog!* by Judy Cox and *Barnyard Slam* by Dian Curtis Regan.



Boy and Bird can go up to the tree house, but Dog cannot. Boy has an idea, and with a little ingenuity and creativity, the three friends can together observe all the good things in the world from their new vantage point—and share some cookies, too.






DINOSAURS DON'T, DINOSAURS DO by Steve Björkman

THE LION AND THE MICE









LATE NATE IN A RACE






FISH HAD A WISH
