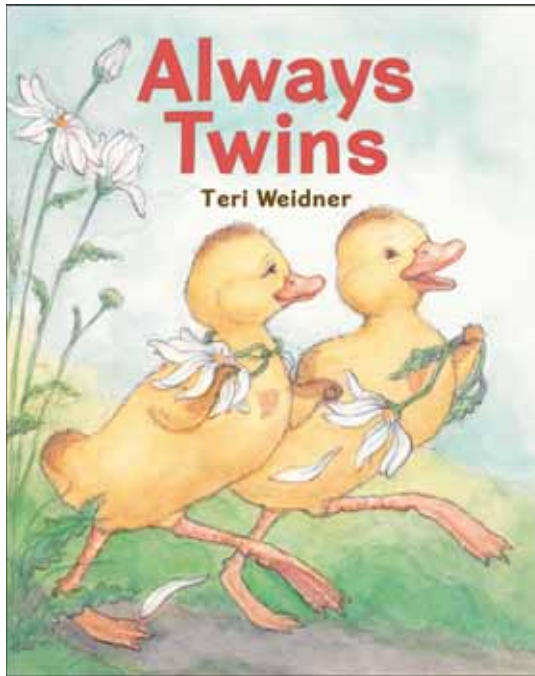
## Ah!

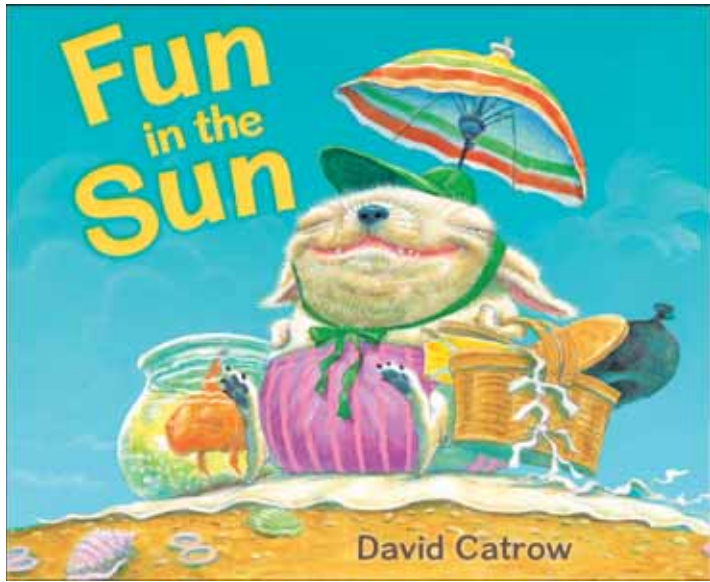

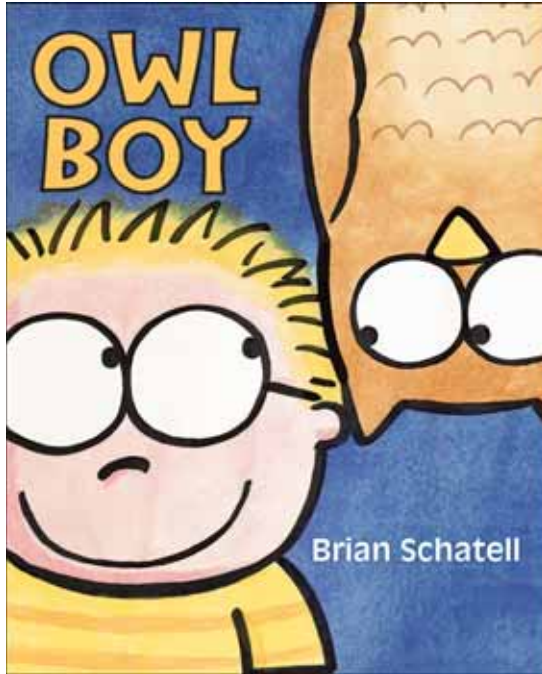
## Fun in the Sun

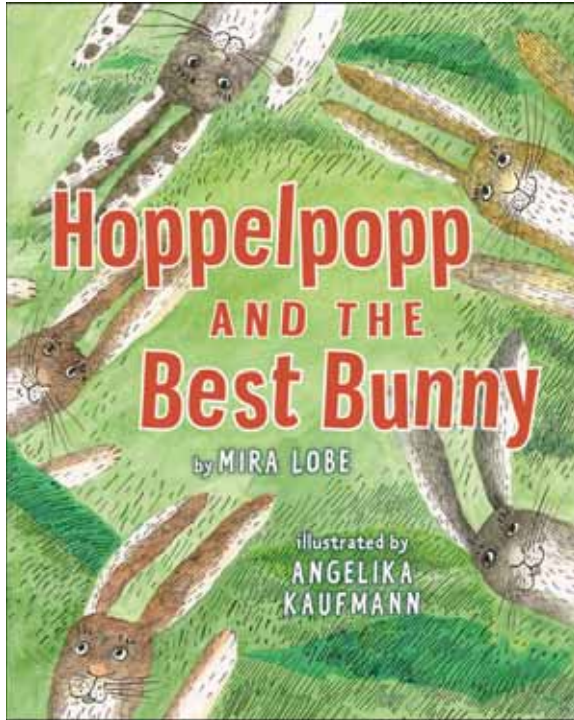
## A Bird Is a Bird

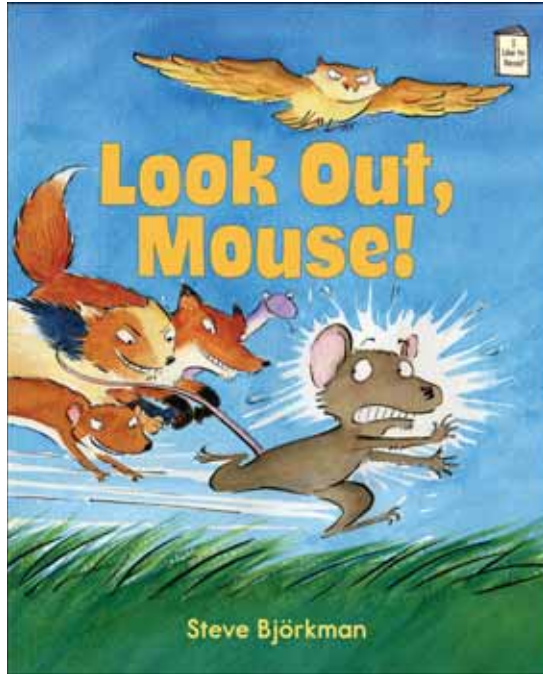

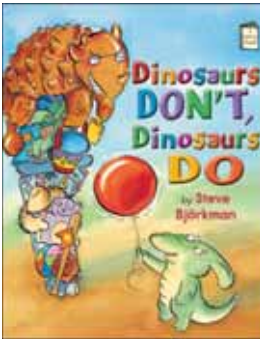

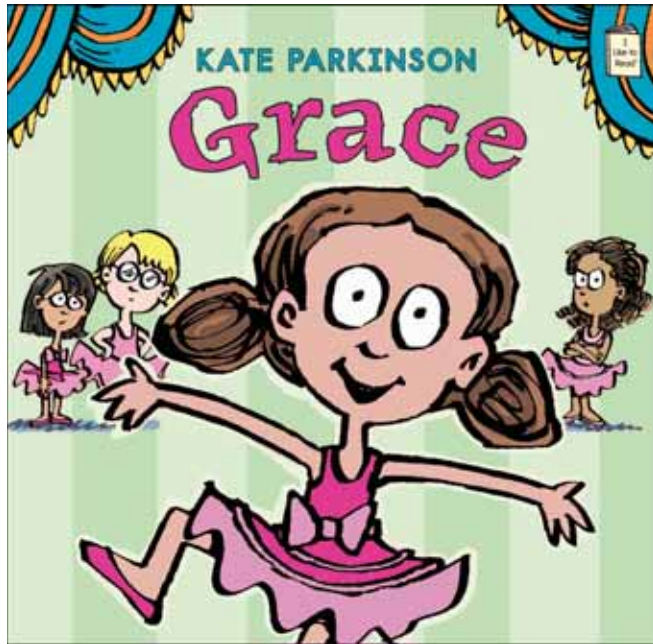
## Look Out, Mouse!

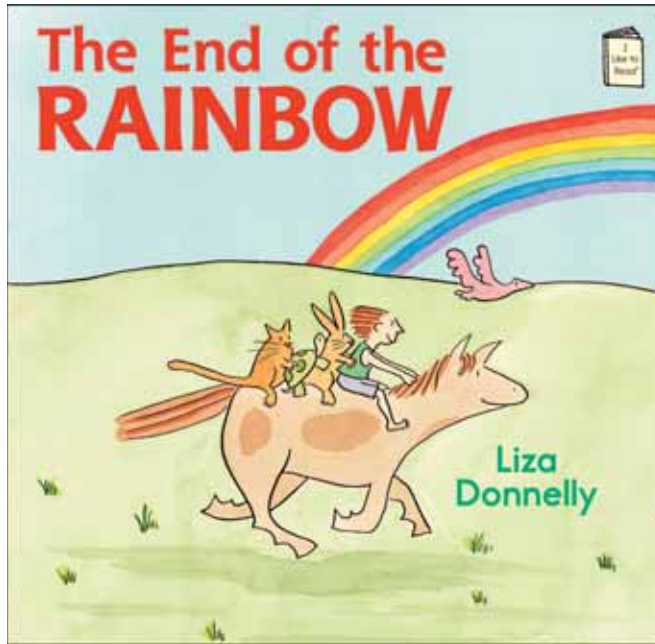
## Grace

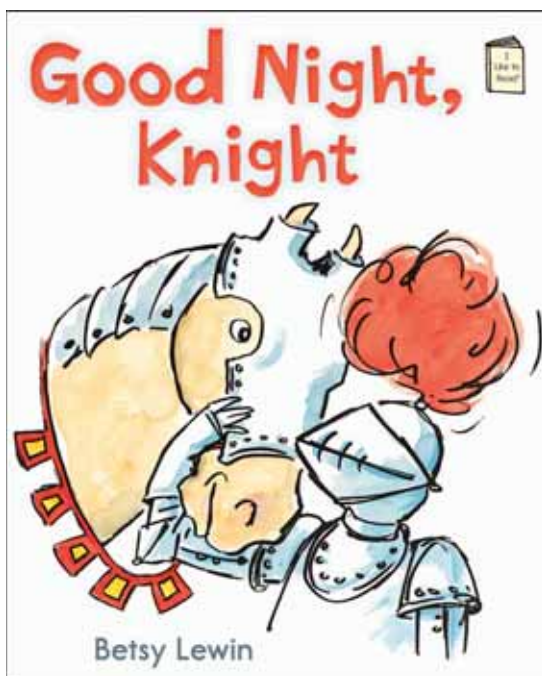

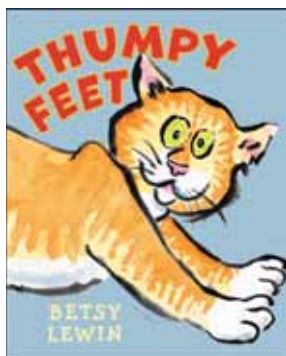

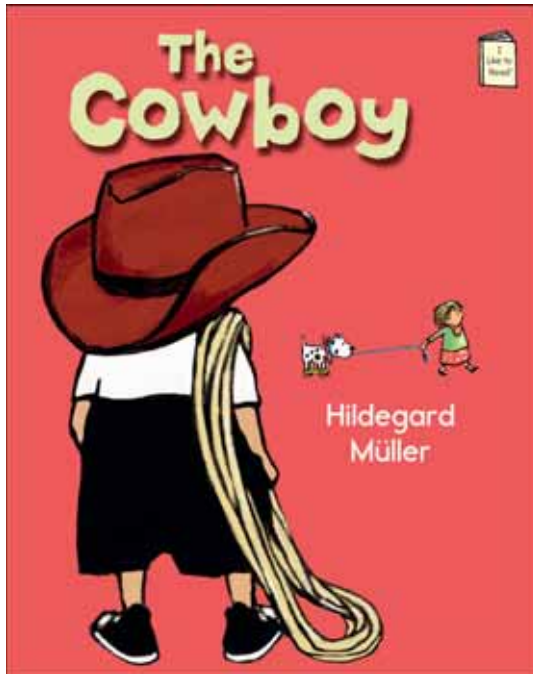
## Good Night, Knight

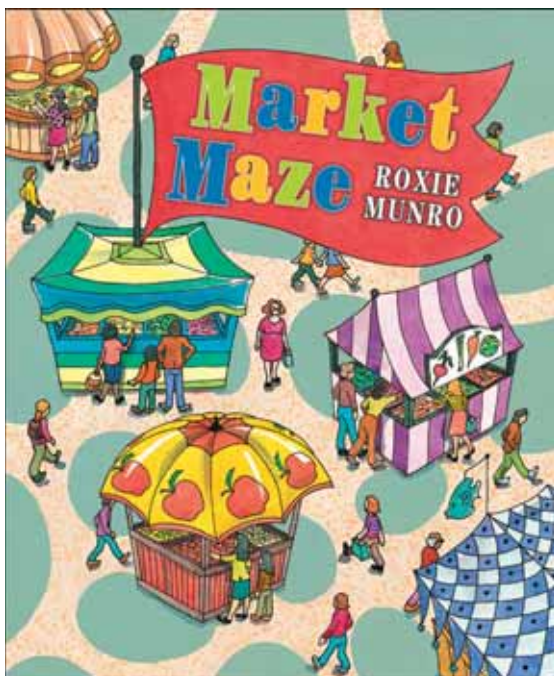
## The Buk Buk Buk Festival
